

Spokane Figure Skating Club Summer Skating Policies 2025

Freestyle Sessions: All freestyle sessions will be designated Open, Low Test, or High Test. The criteria being used to determine Low vs High Test is based on the skater's Skating Skills (Moves in the Field) test level. This will be the last test the skater successfully passed, not the level the skater is currently working toward. Low Test will consist of skaters who are LTS through Pre-Preliminary SS; High Test will consist of skaters who have passed their Preliminary SS test or higher. The Adult skater basis will be through Adult Pre-Bronze for Low Test, and Adult Bronze or higher for High Test. Skaters who pass the Preliminary SS (Adult Bronze) test during the summer may begin skating on High Test sessions after the test results are received. Skaters of any level are welcome to skate on any Open Session. It is recommended that LTS skaters (who are not also involved in Aspire) skate under the instruction of a private lesson coach to learn proper freestyle etiquette.

Exceptions: To protect the quality, safety, and effectiveness of our freestyle sessions we are going to strictly adhere to the Low/High level designations. Exceptions or accommodations will only be granted by the Skating Director for extreme circumstances relating to scheduling conflicts.

Clinics/ASAP Strength/Off Ice Jumps/Off Ice: The designations for freestyle sessions will remain the same for all on ice and off ice clinics. *Exceptions or accommodations will only be granted by the Skating Director or ASAP.*

Purchasing Ice: Components of our summer schedule may be purchased in packages or individually. All packages are priced for 8 weeks of skating/clinics for the price of 7 weeks.

Please note: for much of the summer, Lilac FSC will not have ice at Eagles Ice Arena and Palouse FSC will not have ice in Moscow. As good neighbors, we are generously offering access to our robust number of sessions to their skaters in their time of need. However, our priority is to serve our Spokane FSC and Lake City Figure Skating LTS skaters. Therefore, we are opening our summer packages and individually sessions for purchase to our home club skaters first, on Monday, May 19th. Then, on Monday, June 2nd we will open any remaining spots for outside skaters that would like to reserve our ice time.

We STRONGLY recommend that our SFSC and Lake City skaters purchase packages AND reserve their sessions prior to Monday, June 2nd. We expect our sessions to fill to capacity once we open it to skaters from other clubs. For freestyle ice, this means you should both purchase the package or session, and also make sure each session is RESERVED through Entryeeze for the entire 8 weeks of summer. We can move you around or cancel your reservation if your schedule changes; however, if a session is full, we cannot add you to that full session. **Bottom line, the day you purchase your package also RESERVE all the sessions you expect to skate or have lessons on for the entire summer schedule.**
